Collegiate Music Education Day

On February 23, 2016, FMEA hosted the first ever Collegiate Music Education Day at the Capitol. There were 33 collegiate music education students in attendance from Florida State University, Florida A&M University, and the University of Central Florida. Board members advised students on how to effectively communicate the importance of music education to legislators, giving them the confidence to become engaged in the political process. After the initial morning meeting, students were divided into delegations organized by district to discuss with legislators the *Every Student Succeeds Act* and their support of the inclusion of music and the arts as part of a well-rounded education.
