Woman's Club of Coconut Grove Scholarship Program

Overview:

The Young Artists' Gallery (YAG), is a juried art exhibit open to high school students of Miami-Dade County public schools. The Woman's Club of Coconut Grove awards over \$25,000 in scholarships through its YAG program to deserving young artists every year. YAG was established in 2001 as an annual event designed to provide scholarships as well as the opportunity for talented high school art students to learn about careers in the visual arts and to offer support and encouragement for young talent by giving them the possibility to show their work to art patrons and to see how their work can be marketable.

The Art Education District Office of Dade County pre-judges the artworks submitted and selects the finalists which are then displayed at the Woman's Club of Coconut Grove the 2nd weekend of March. The artists in the exhibit will be able to offer their work for sale if they wish. Finalists and scholarship winners will be honored at a prestigious awards reception held at the club the 2nd Saturday of March each year.

Awards: The Woman's Club of Coconut Grove will award several scholarships ranging from \$1,500 to \$3,000. Ten students will receive Honorable Mention Awards along with \$100 prize. The teachers of all awarded students will receive an honorarium of \$100.

Eligibility: The Young Artists' Gallery Program is open to high school students from Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

* **Note: Only original artworks will be accepted and displayed at the exhibit (no prints or reproductions, except for photography and digital.)**

Jurying:

Entries will first be juried by the Art Education District Office in early February. An independent panel of jurors chosen by the WCCG will then judge the accepted entries and select the scholarship winners and the Merit Award winners.

Works will be judged according to:

- Artistic Quality in development of Concept and Originality
- Artistic Quality in composition and overall design
- Overall Craftmanship/ use of medium and Technique.
- Overall impression of the art- (overall artistic quality of the work including proper display, proper and accurate description of medium or technique/process, title or even written interpretation of the piece if needed)

Size restriction / installation: No size restriction but if the piece needs special installation, the student or the teacher is responsible for installing and taking down the piece.

***PLEASE NOTE:**

- **All pieces must be ready to hang/display unless the artwork is not a standard shape or size.**
- **3D works that cannot stand alone or be clipped to our hanging system must include pedestals for display**
- **Unstretched canvas is acceptable, but all other 2D works not presented in a mat must be wired for hanging when submitted, *or will not be included in the exhibition.***

Artwork Drop-off and Pickup:

Accepted entries need to be delivered to the Woman's Club of Coconut Grove (WCCG) March 6th 3-7 pm or March 7th 3-7pm (time frames have changed; in the past, 12 PM was too early for most teachers who are at school at mid-day.

After the exhibit, all artworks need to be picked up from the same location
Sunday, March 13th 2-6pm or Monday, March 14th 3-6pm

Submission of entries Step by Step:

1. Students must submit their work to their art teachers in the following categories /Media

- Drawing: ink, graphite, charcoal, pastel, and other
- Painting: oil, acrylic, Watercolor and other
- Other (2-Dimensional) : mix-media, collage, printmaking, and other
- Digital Art: Photography (digital or not), Photoshop, Illustrator and other (No stills of 3-D digital animation)
- 3-Dimensional: sculpture, ceramics, wearable, and other

Note: Only original artworks will be accepted and displayed at the exhibit (no prints or reproductions with the exception of Photography or Digital Art).

2. Teachers must select a maximum of 10 pieces of student artwork to submit.

Only 1 entry per student (different art teachers may submit the same student)

3. Teachers must submit the selected works electronically by Midnight on Thursday, January 26, 2023

JPEG image (no larger than 3.32 MB)

4. Teachers and students prepare the accepted entries:

- All work submitted must be ready to hand/ display unless the artwork is not a standard shape or size and cannot be matted or framed. There is No size restriction but if the piece needs special installation, the student or the teacher is responsible for installing and taking down the piece.
- Please keep the back of the works as clean as possible clear of colored tape or papers since our exhibit walls are metal grids and the back of the works can be seen. We like to display all the works with a neutral background if possible
- Complete the enclosed inventory sheet.
- If the students wish to sell their art, they must also complete a permission slip enclosed and staple the form to the inventory sheet (Not to the back of the works). Prices must not exceed \$500. The students will receive checks made out to them for their sales at the end of the show.
- The release form generated from the electronic submission should also be stapled to the inventory sheet (Not to the back of the works).
- All artwork labels must be TYPED and adhered to the front bottom right hand corner of the mat or frame
